If another family member has already undergone genetic testing for cancer, contact a genetic service for further advice



#### Introduce the concept of mainstream genetic testing to the patient

Provide the patient with information and brochures

This may happen over more than one appointment



#### Obtain informed consent

Complete/sign the consent form with the patient Discuss how patient information and results will be handled

Discuss test timeframe and possible outcomes/results

Discuss potential implications for family members

Discuss when referral to genetics will be offered



#### Complete the request form

Include the test/panel being requested and sample collection requirements

Provide patient eligibility criteria and/or billing details

Confirm patient consent. Some labs may require a copy of the consent form.



#### Organise blood/saliva sample for genetic testing

Confirm that sample has been taken/received by lab

Confirm timeframe for results

Plan for results delivery (appointment)



#### Pathology laboratory issues genetic test result to the requesting physician
